HEALTH AND WELLBEING: MESSAGE FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE

Face coverings:

Wear something that covers your nose and mouth:

- on public transport. Mask-wearing has been compulsory on public transport in England since 15 June.
- when you go to hospital appointments or visit someone in hospital. Mask-wearing has been compulsory at NHS facilities across the UK since 15 June.
- If you can, also wear a face covering in other places when it's hard to stay away from people.

Wearing a face covering in shops and supermarkets in England is to become mandatory from 24 July 2020. Those who fail to comply with the new rules will face a fine of up to £100, the government has announced.

 Face coverings should not be worn by children under 3 and people who would find wearing them difficult (such as people with breathing difficulties).

To find out who needs to wear a face covering on public transport, see safer travel guidance for passengers on GOV.UK.

SUMMER EXAM RESULTS 2020

Just a reminder that results day for students who would have taken exams this summer will be on:

Thursday 13th August - Year 13 students can collect their results on 13th August between 9.00am - 12.00 pm from the sports hall. Mr El'Habid will be available to offer support for any students in need of advice regarding their next steps.

Thursday 20th August - Year 11 students can collect their results between 9.00am and 12.00pm from the sports hall. Enrolment for joining Archbishop Ilsley Sixth Form will take place in the main hall.

Only students can collect their results from school. Unfortunately, parents/carers or other family members will not be allowed on site. Any results that are not collected from school at the allocated times will be posted home by 1st class mail to the student. Textbooks or revision guides which should be returned to school can be left on the tables provided. To maintain the safety of students and staff, when collecting your results, please follow the directions from members of staff. Measures will be put in place to ensure social distancing and please use the hand sanitising stations. Should you or any member of your family be displaying any symptoms for COVID-19, please do not collect your results from school.

We very much look forward to seeing students on their results days and helping them with their next steps. Year 11 students, don't forget to continue to use the Year 11-12 transition materials on our website to help prepare you for your new path at Archbishop IIsley Catholic School.

SEPTEMBER 2020 AUTUMN START DATES

Please see below for details of the plans for the start of term for each year group. We are deliberately staggering the start of term to allow us time to fully brief the students on the new arrangements for their day before the timetable starts.

Students should not arrive before their allocated times.

SCHOOL ENTRANCES AND EXITS FOR USE IN SEPTEMBER 2020

In order to manage student numbers entering and exiting the school site, we will be using our three entrances from September, so please check which gate your child/children will need to use.


Year 11 students - Use gate by Holy Souls Social Club at beginning and end of school day

There will be other measures in place and some changes within the school day, to include cleaning stations, staggered breaks, lunchtimes and end of day dismissal and zoned playgrounds and social time to ensure that both staff and students are as safe as possible.


All students must be in full school uniform and should have the necessary equipment with them on their first day back in September.
